If you were there four years ago, even two years ago, you would have experienced less than a third of what they now have on offer. The modern extension has been described as "MOVE on steroids", and the exhibitions are much more significant.

The Kenworth & Legends of Road Transport exhibition is fascinating and the stories of the drivers make you connect in a much more personal way with the exhibition.

The Fashion exhibition is also extensive and creatively presented. Of course, there are cars too, beautifully restored. Three of the top 10 Australian restorers actually live and work in Shepparton and their work is on display in the venue.

M.O.V.E regularly hosts other exhibitions and whilst we are there the Elfin cars will be displayed, which should be a real treat

... and speaking of treats, if the above is not to your taste then you will find an array of shops two minutes walk away. There's the Chocolate and Apple Factory that hands out samples, a collectables shop bursting at the seams and a proprietor happy to talk on any subject. There's even a nursery selling garden ornaments where you could buy a gnome to match your Sprite.

Our accommodation is at the Peppermill Inn, which combines motel and hotel; we book in, park our cars in front of our rooms and meet for Happy Hour. At this stage we are planning to have Happy Hour in a couple of the larger rooms so keep and eye and ear out for those room number/s. Held on a sealed surface at the Geelong Motorsport Complex there was enough space to run two tests at once. They attracted a field of 37 competitors including our five from AHSDC.

Three tests were run with two runs at each test and impressively they used electronic timing with a large screen digital display for the spectators' and competitors' benefit.

Owen and Brendan Crombie put on a tussle for the best time Owen succeeding with 97.52 from Brendan at 98.12. David Norris followed with 108.25, then Mike Dore on 109.60 and Ruth Norris on 110.15.

Notably there were five female competitors and six juniors. The diversity of cars was also interesting with MGB, MGA, MGY and TC, TD and TF as well as Midgets and our cars. Some of the Bs and As were very well driven and put us to shame.

All in all a well run day in great weather even if a long way from Mornington.

18 March MSCA Sandown

In spite of the heat Sandown went ahead although obviously not the same fire risk as Rob Roy. Seven competitors were entered from AHSDC, two Honda S2000s, two MX5s and three Sprites.





Linton Coombs - Honda - took the honours with a 1:26.4475 ahead of Glenn Coombs also in the Honda, on 1:30.3018. Rod Vogt, Mk1 in his usual style put in a quick 1:33.9293 ahead of Bob Lomas' Mk1 at 1:35.8028, then Iain Johnson in his MX5 at 1:36.9397 fractionally ahead of Peter Clarke's MX5 at 1:36.9494 then Peter Harrison's Sprite on 1:39.6825.

Interesting to view these times against Mike Trathen's Sprite viewed at the March general meeting which has done 1:24s.




interest in our cars and club and I will try to get a position at next year's GP.



Chris Lawson was a very active and enthusiastic member who did much to lay the foundation for our club as our first Secretary in July 1966. At the end of the year

(1966/7) he was the first Sprite Champion in his Mk1 to hold the prestigious Sprite Championship Trophy (and the lid fell off even then!) In 1967/8 Chris was President.

Then came the era of the MGB brigade. Chris and his first wife Jill, along with Nigel and I decided to drive up to Broken Hill to see Jill's parents – in the summer!

Somewhere along the B79 it was 38°C and all the ice in the eskys had melted, despite the fact we had our hoods up.

We drove on to the nearest roadhouse to try and get some relief from the heat. The air conditioners had broken down, but the owner cheerily told us that it had dropped several degrees down to 39°C so we should feel cooler!

We toured around Broken Hill, which was an eye opener, drove to Silverton Hotel and sailed in Lake Menindee. Chris decided to take the boat out on his own; the wind suddenly completely died down and eventually we had to get him towed back to land.

In the early '70s Richard Pollock and Chris started a business called Link, primarily making leather belts and bespoke cuff links. Former club member, Phil James worked with them for several years. He recalls that they worked long and hard, often not going home until 9 p.m.

However, it was a happy crew and they had lots of laughs. During this time Chris gathered some interesting cars – there was an International Truck from the '20s, a 1927 Rugby (assembled by the Durant Motors Company of New York), a 1927 Dodge Ute and a hankering for a Renault 300 Megane!

When he married Jan and she worked in the business there was a Datsun 1600 (good choice having had one myself around 1976!).

Twenty-five years ago Chris joined the Mercedes-Benz Club of Victoria and often displayed his beautiful red 1987 560 SL. We would then meet up either at his club stand or ours to have a good catch up.

Chris was supportive of our club for many years and came to our major club reunions. He will be greatly missed.



He continued to attend National meetings up until 2018 and ventured south a number of times for touring events




and to catch up with old friends.

LOG BOOK CLUB PERMIT SCHEME

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO AHSDC MEMBERS REGARDING THE CLUB PERMIT SCHEME

Recent changes to the scheme mean that when signing new club permit applications, club safety officers/scrutineers are required to complete a Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration form declaring that the vehicle is eligible, safe for use on the road, and that it meets the applicable requirements for the category of vehicle for which the club permit is sought.

This implies that when signing renewals of Permits we have the same responsibility to see that the vehicle for which the renewal is sought is in fact the same car in the same condition still meeting the Vehicle Eligibility & Standards.

We would expect that this is a mere formality however, to be seen to be administering in the spirit of the scheme and to protect our members privileges under the scheme as best we can we must see the vehicle concerned before we sign a Club Permit Application or a Permit Renewal. Your Committee has passed the following resolution:

From 1May 2016, AHSDC members wishing to use the Club Permit Scheme must attend a minimum of ONE club meeting/club event/event at which the club has a group representation, each year – and have the relevant car sighted by one of the Club Permit Scheme Signatories before the club signs the Club Permit Renewal for that year. If you have genuine hardship meeting this requirement due to your country location please speak to the Club Signatories to make alternative sighting arrangements.

For some of you we do understand that this might require a little bit of planning and you might see it as onerous however, in reality it is part of our joint (club/member) responsibility under the scheme and it is really very little to ask of ourselves for the privilege of driving our cars on public roads for hundreds of dollars less than if it were on a full registration.

Club Permit Application Requirements

At the end of January 2015 the new club permit requirements came into play. For those people with an existing AHSDC club permit, nothing changes with regard to the renewal that you receive from VICROADS each year (this still has to be signed off by a club signatory when the permit is due for renewal). However, remember that you need to be a financial member of the Austin Healey Sprite Drivers' Club Inc. This means rejoining each year by 1 January of the forthcoming year if you have an ongoing Club permit.

If your membership lapses your permit/s are considered to be invalid.

You also need to fill in the AHSDC acknowledgment form at the start of each year whereby you agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the scheme. This will either be sent out towards the end of each year, or can be obtained from Warren Reid. Remember when using your car on a Club Permit the log book must be filled in otherwise severe penalties will be imposed.

New Club Permit Application Requirements

If you have a new car to put on the club permit system or are transferring a car from another club or from another member then the following requirements apply:

- 1. You need to download or obtain from VICROADS and fill in the "Club Permit Application" and the "Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration" forms. Both these forms then need to be signed by the club permit officer (Warren Reid). If Warren Reid is unavailable, then other signatories listed below can also sign.
- 2. Any signatory signing off the "Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration" must sight the vehicle for which the Club Permit is being sought and assess the extent (if any) of modifications.
- 3. You must obtain a current Victorian Roadworthy Certificate for the vehicle and supply a copy to the club signatory.
- 4. You must supply six (6) time stamped photos covering front, back, driver wside, open driver's door, chassis number, engine number to Warren Reid. Preference is for electronic versions of photos.
- 5. Once items 1 to 5 have been addressed then you take the signed club signatory forms along with the RWC to a VICROADS office and pay for either a 45 or 90 day permit and receive the plates to place on the car.
